## The Protocol of the final meeting of the International Young Physicists' Tournament Committee of the 11<sup>th</sup> International Young Physicists' Tournament

- 1. The president of the Local Organizing Committee, Rudolf Lehn, presented the report concerning problems connected with the organization of the IYPT.
- 2. The International Organization Committee accepted the proposal presented by Prof. Romano Rupp (Vienna University) to organize the 12<sup>th</sup> IYPT in 1999 in Vienna, Austria.
- 3. There has been taken decision to establish functions of the President and the Secretary of the International Young Physicists' Tournament. Prof. Gunnar Tibell (Uppsala) has been elected as the President and Dr. Andrzej Nadolny (Warsaw) has been elected as the Secretary, both for the period of four years.
  - The main task of the President is to represent IYPT organizers e.g. in international institutions and organizations. The Secretary taks are to provide the Local Organization Committees with all appropriate information and to take care over the archives of the International Young Physicists' Tournament.
- 4. The International Organization Committee stated that a special foundation (or other kind of organization) should be established in order to support financially and organizationally Local Organization Committees in organizing IYPTs.
